the audience, the first thing I did was look for you in your usual place to the right of the stage where you sit during council meetings. Without you there, I panicked and wanted to leave the Vet's Hall immediately. I did not know that a red gun is a simulated weapon. To me, it looked real and has no place in a public meeting of our community. I never want to see a weapon, genuine or simulated, that is not attached to bonafide law enforcement in a public meeting again in this town. What can be done to prevent another incident like this? Will it be the policy of Morro Bay PD to enhance security at future public meetings, especially council meetings in light of this recent event? In addition, based on his obvious need to express his 2nd amendment rights in inappropriate ways, will you be on the lookout for David Durringer attending public meetings in our community?

In a million years I would have never guessed we would have an issue like this demonstrated by our community leaders/potential leaders. I hope I never see it again.
